PRCS Report Update

From Saturday, October 7, 2023, at 06:00 AM

Until Saturday, October 21, 2023, at 24:00

According to PRCS president to declare emergency status and raise the degree of alert and readiness, PRCS is working round the clock with its full humanitarian and physical power since the **Fifteen day** in a row and is still responding to accelerations on the ground.

Latest Update:

Gaza Strip:

(21.10.2023) The Rafah borders crossing witnessed today the entry of the first shipment of Humanitarian Aid into the Gaza Strip. PRCS teams received 20 trucks of Medical Supplies, Food and Water; from the Egyptian Red Crescent.

PRCS accompanied with UNRWA, were at the border crossing since the early morning, and in a back-to-back procedure; PRCS volunteers helped to get the 20 UNRWA trucks to move aid into UNRWA warehouse in Gaza Strip.

PRCS has been preparing and setting up the needed structures and support to manage aid through Radar crossing for the past week, including mobilization of staff and volunteers, renting extra storage space, and working intensively with Egyptian Red Crescent to coordinate priority needs and logistical support.

Today's entry of the 20 trucks is a welcomed glimpse of hope, but this minuscule aid represents a drop in the ocean. We call on the international community to secure the continued flow of humanitarian aid into Gaza including through the Israeli controlled crossings.

Furthermore, without Fuel entering the Gaza Strip to support generating electricity, thousands of Palestinian lives are at risk of death in hospitals. Ambulances will no longer be able to save lives. Bakeries will no longer be able to provide bread. It shall also leave the population without potable water, and risking the outbreak of diseases.

While PRCS commends the efforts of every party that keeps advocating towards entry of humanitarian aid, from the Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement, UN agencies, Governments and International Agencies; PRCS reiterates the importance of having a nonstop safe entry of aid into Gaza, in line with International Law and the Geneva Conventions; without hindering or instrumentalizing aid; but rather responding to the call of humanity to save lives and preserve human dignity.

PRCS stands ready and prepared to receive and support the entry of International Aid, mobilizing all needed resources and coordinating with all relevant parties and agencies.

- The Israeli occupation forces bombard a group of 24 residential towers in Al-Zahra City in the Central Governorate of Gaza, which exacerbated the suffering of civilians and increasing the number of displaced people.
- The Israeli occupation forces continue to target towers, residential buildings, mosques, main streets and civilian populations in various areas of the southern governorates, resulting in a large number of fatalities, including children and women, and the displacement of civilians seeking safety.

- PRCS Ambulance centers are still operating at high capacity in response to the current situation, as the number of ambulances operating in the field has reached (30) ambulances and (114) paramedics, drivers, first responders, volunteers and managerial staff).
- 7 hospitals and 21 health centers out of service and running out of fuel due to the Israeli occupation forces bombardment.
- Today, one of the Civil Defense members was martyrdom and 4 others were injured after being bombard by the Israeli occupation forces while they doing their humanitarian missions in the Khirbet Al-Adas area in Rafah governorate the southern Gaza Strip.

West Bank

The total number of cases that PRCS EMS/ Ambulance teams have dealt with in the West Bank since Saturday, October 7, 2023 is (1,751), in addition to (33) martyrs until Saturday 21 October 2023, 24:00. While PRCS crews dealt with (43) injuries and (1) martyr during Saturday 21 October 2023, 19:00.

Occupied Jerusalem:

• PRCS's crews in occupied Jerusalem dealt with (110) cases, including (5) martyrs and (105) injury, since Saturday, October 7, 2023 until Saturday 21 October 2023, 24:00.

Violations against PRCS services:

Gaza Strip: Since the beginning of war and accelerations, (16) violations was recorded against PRCS crews and headquarters resulting the martyrdom of (4) EMS staff, (5) injuries in EMS staff, in addition to (8) ambulances severe damages and severe damages also in PRCS headquarter North of Gaza strip, and damages in PRCS Operations Room.

West Bank: Since Saturday, October 7, 2023 until Saturday 21 October 2023, 11:00, the Palestinian Red Crescent Society- PRCS crews have faced many challenges and violations in the West Bank, were reported and resulting (51) violations.

Occupied Jerusalem: (3) violations were recorded.

Displacement of citizens in Gaza Strip:

- The official authorities received 1,400 reports of missing persons under the rubble, including 720 children.
- Since the beginning of the escalation, the Palestine Red Crescent Society in Gaza City, Al-Quds Hospital and Al-Amal Hospital in Khan Yunis Governorate have witnessed the displacement of thousands of citizens, seeking safety, due to the continued threats of the Israeli occupation forces to the civilian population by targeting their homes, as the two PRCS/HQ are witnessing a very severe overcrowding situation in excess of their capacity, so that hundreds of displaced people sleeping in front of the entrance to the PRCS, administrative offices and patient rooms. In addition, the number of displaced people in the PRCS in Gaza and KhanYunis its estimated around more than **12,000** citizens distributed at (PRCS/HQ in Gaza: **9,000** citizens and in Khan Yunis: **3,000** citizens), this increase in the number of displaced people due to the increasing of the Israeli occupation forces threats. The latest of the displacement more than **2,000** citizens due to the continuous bombardment and destruction of citizens' homes in Tel Al-Hawa neighborhoods in the vicinity of the hospital. **As noticed the number of displaced people increased at night from the daytime around 1,000 IDPs.**
- A considerable number of citizens have been displaced from border areas to urban centers and in shelters or with host families, as the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East (UNRWA) announced that its shelters received more than 400,000 displaced people, as official sources announced an increase in the number of displaced people by more than **one million** displaced people in different areas.
- As occupation targeting of schools has extended, the occupation forced **19** schools out of service due to significant damage, while **160** schools suffered varying degrees of damage, exacerbating the suffering of displaced individuals and their overcrowding in shelter centers.

PRCS Disaster Risk Management Department Interventions:

Gaza strip: As a result of Israeli aggression on Gaza strip and threats to target civilians, it was impossible to provide emergency relief services in the field in Gaza and Northern Gaza governorates. Relief services were limited to providing services to the displaced PRCS headquarters (**Al Amal City, and Al Noor**), its hospitals, and shelter centers, where the Disaster Risk Management Department distributed non-food relief items, with following details:

- PRCS, Disaster Risk Department provided urgent relief assistance to 8 displacement centers in Gaza City (7 schools and 1 church), this assistance included 902 mattresses, 902 blankets / 182 water Jerrycan, and foods parcels that distributed to the IDPs at PRCS/HQ Gaza and Al Quds hospital, and all of these assistances available in PRCS warehouses stock, which provided through the contributions from the International Movement partners.

West Bank and Jerusalem: PRCS’s Disaster Risk Management Department provided relief items for Gaza workers who were deported by the occupation forces from their work places in the occupied territories to the West Bank governorates (Ramallah, Al-Bireh, Tubas, Qalqilya, Nablus, and Jerusalem), where relief items were provided (mattresses, blankets, hygiene kits, kitchen sets, towels) for **(405)** individuals.

Community Awareness Committees Interventions:

Gaza Strip: PRCS crews (community awareness committees) have dealt since the beginning of war and accelerations with the following:

Psycho- social Department Interventions:

Gaza strip: Psychological intervention teams continue to provide psychological first aid- PFA to ambulance teams working in current events, providing the service to **(2,506)** beneficiaries.

West Bank: PRCS’s Psycho-social and Mental Health Department provided its services to “Gaza workers who were deported by the occupation forces to the West Bank governorates,” where their number reached **(1,720)** beneficiaries in shelter centers. In addition to a daily sponsored guidance publication on social media pages, where the number of beneficiaries reached **(59,151)** through:

- Publishing awareness messages
- Psychological first aid- PFA
- Psychosocial support in times of war and crises.
- Providing assistive tools through the Rehabilitation Department
- Daily guidance posts on social media
